Applying for your F-1 student visa

To study in your the UMass Lowell GSSP, you will need to apply for an F-1 visa at your nearest U.S. embassy or consulate. You must bring the following documents along to your appointment:

- > a valid passport
- > required photographs
- > proof of prior education and test scores (transcript, diploma, etc.)
- > a form I-20 (for F-1 visa) or DS-2019 (for J-1 visa) issued by UMass Lowell
- > proof of admission to that institution (letter of acceptance)
- > proof that you have sufficient funds to study (bank statements)

You should be prepared to demonstrate that you have close ties to your home country and that you have full intention of returning home after you complete your studies.



Traveling to the United States

You may be asked to present the following documents when you enter the U.S., so have them with you in your carry-on luggage along with your airline tickets and itinerary:

- > passport
- > visa document (Form I-20). If the U.S. Embassy returned your visa document in a sealed envelope only to be opened by a U.S. official at the U.S. Port of Entry, please honor this.
- > UMass Lowell Admissions letter
- > the original financial documentation that you provided to U.S. embassy/consulate



Checklist: what to do before you leave home

PAY SEVIS FEE AND MAKE APPOINTMENT WITH THE U.S. EMBASSY/CONSULATE

Make an appointment with the U.S. embassy or consulate to obtain your F-1 visa. Please notify UMass Lowell GSSP staff as soon as you've received your visa.

FULL PAYMENT OF INITIAL INVOICE

Payment of your initial invoice is due within 21 days of receiving your F-1 visa, or two weeks before the start of classes, whichever is earlier. Please note that you will not be enrolled in classes until your invoice has been paid in full.

SUBMIT YOUR HOUSING CONTRACT

Please submit your [Housing Contract](#) by the listed deadline on our website. We cannot secure on-campus accommodation at UMass Lowell without this form. You can find detailed instructions on how to submit your housing contract on our [website](#).

UMASS LOWELL HEALTH FORMS

Per Massachusetts law, all UMass Lowell students are required to submit the UMass Lowell Health Examination Report and Immunization Records. You may download all forms at uml.edu/student-services/Health/Health-Services-Requirements.aspx. Make an appointment with your doctor to receive your health exam and all required immunizations. You must bring the Health Forms with you to your appointment.

Make travel arrangements to arrive at Boston Logan International Airport one day prior to your orientation date. As soon as you have booked your flights, please complete the online arrival form so we can schedule your airport pick up:

UMass Lowell accommodation

Research shows that students who live on campus earn higher grades than those who do not. Students also feel more connected to the university community. To secure on-campus housing, please submit your [UMass Lowell housing contract](#) one month before the start of classes.



ON-CAMPUS HOUSING

All undergraduate students are required to live on campus during the first year while enrolled in the Undergraduate Pathway Program. Graduate students have the option to live on or off campus.

All campus residence halls are a short walk from classroom buildings, dining halls, the Campus Recreation Center, the University Library and more. The free University shuttle bus also transports students around campus seven days a week.

All bedrooms are fully furnished with a bed, dresser, desk, chair and wardrobe. Rooms are wired for high-speed internet access and standard cable television. Many of the residence halls have common TV rooms, laundry facilities, kitchens and vending machine areas.

GRADUATE OFF-CAMPUS HOUSING

If you choose to live off campus it is your responsibility to find and secure an apartment. Visit [globaluml.com/microsites/predeparture](#) to explore your off-campus housing options. You will also find the Off-Campus Housing Waiver, which is required for all students living off campus.

DINING AND MEAL PLANS

Campus dining at UMass Lowell offers more than a dozen dining options including fast food, takeaway meals and three dining halls, which offer everything from made-to-order dinners, salad bars, deli and grills. The meal plan covers meals each day for the entire week of the semester.

All students living in residence halls are required to be on a residential meal plan, which comes with extra cash to spend across campus. Graduate students who are placed in apartments have the option of signing up for a meal plan.

MOVE-IN DAY AND CHECK IN

On move-in day you will receive your orientation materials and check into your residence halls. You must arrive between 9:00am and 5:00pm to check in. Please visit [globaluml.com/microsites/predeparture/orientation](#) to confirm your check-in location.

If you arrive after 5:00pm, you will be responsible for your own overnight accommodation.

SHORT TERM HOUSING

If you arrive prior to your move-in date, you will need to make temporary housing arrangements. Possible options include:

You will need to pay for your stay by credit card upon arrival.


ORIENTATION

Lowell, Massachusetts: Your new home




